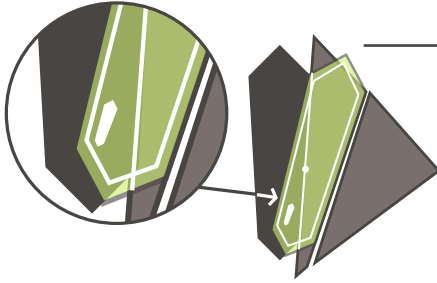


HALF BURST BLOCK

Follow diagrams to make block



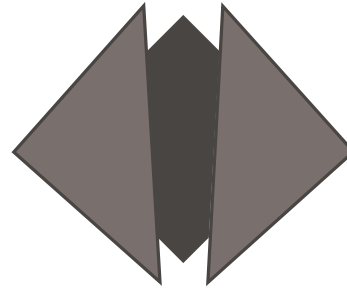
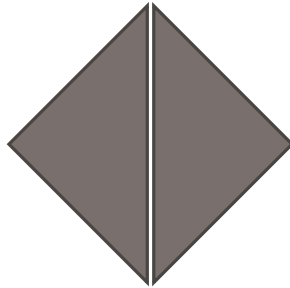
finished block



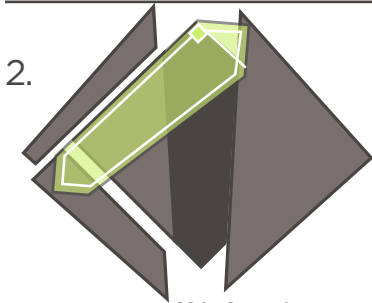
Hint: A "wedge" shape is etched into the lower corner of the template. When cutting the wedges, that etched marker should be on the wedge piece of your fabric to make sure you are cutting from the the correct side of the template. To ensure that your wedge angles are the same, always keep the bottom tip of the template on the edge of your fabric wedge.



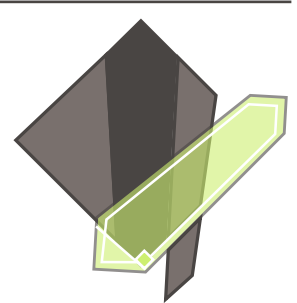
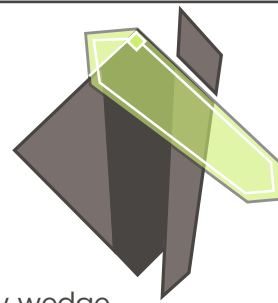
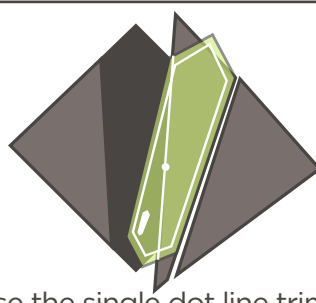

start with two 10x10 squares, using the template cut the 3 shapes from one square and cut the other square diagonally

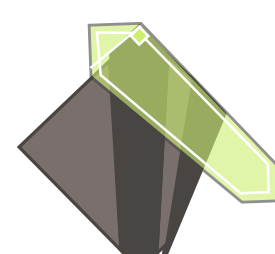


square off left side

use the single dot line trim for new wedge



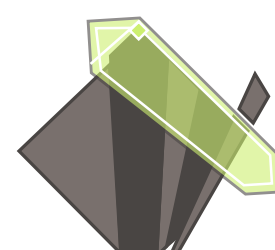
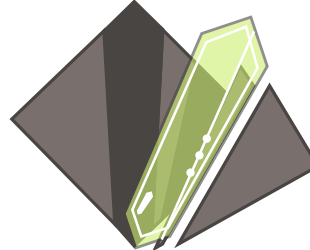
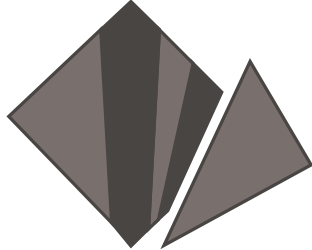

align the triangles like they were cut from the template

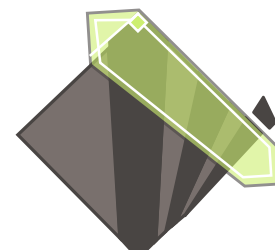
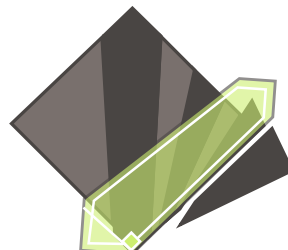
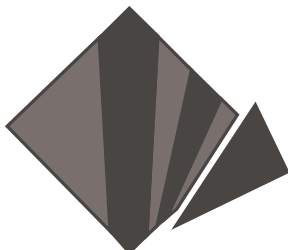
use the double dot line trim for new wedge
